- **UN Recognition for Green Legacy Program**



In November the United Nations Billion Tree Program recognized the contribution of Wellington County's **Green Legacy Program** and now includes them in their international register. To date Green Legacy has planted more than 1,000,000 trees and is the largest municipal tree-planting program in North America! Eden Mills knows the power of this organization, and its nursery manager, superman Rob Johnson, from the past three years of Earth Day plantings and the school program at Rockwood Centennial. **Green Legacy has just produced a film documentary on the program, which we will be screening in the near future in Eden Mills.**

The UN Program has registered almost 11,000,000,000 trees planted towards its 13,000,000,000 (Yes! 13 **billion** tree) goal. The program's Nobel-prize winning Kenyan patron, Professor Wangari Maathai, is the subject of a film documentary *Taking Root* which Libby and Glenn Little screened in their backyard cinema last summer, and which is available in our permanent resource library.

- **Environmental Science Students Work Program 2011
Footprint Survey to be Bi-annual**

Last year's change to using village volunteers to distribute the Survey proved to be very successful. Full confidentiality was assured by the students undertaking all the analysis and reporting of individual results to residents. The village effort was really well coordinated by Kathie Lamie and all the volunteers dedicated a lot of time and energy in assuring a good response rate. Lee Wisener provided important expertise in the analysis.

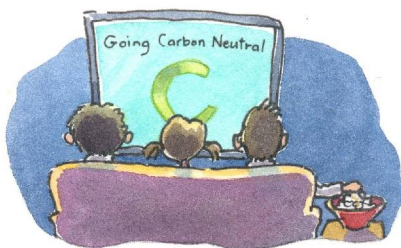
This more neighbour-to-neighbour approach to the survey was very time-consuming for the volunteers. Therefore, we have concluded that a biannual survey is going to be the most effective way to proceed. Last year's survey showed that we are making progress! Our collective community footprint has decreased by more than 6% since the beginning of the project – against the still, sadly general, Canadian **upward** trend. BRAVO all!

This offers a great opportunity for the University of Guelph students to undertake a detailed research study every second year. This year they are hoping to develop a **“made in Eden Mills” carbon offsetting scheme**. Much more on this in a later Newsletter, but the key notion is that anyone wishing to purchase offsets can ensure that the funds go to worthwhile village projects. Lee Wisener, Charles Simon, Brian Husband, and Ward Chesworth are guiding the work of the students.

So, be prepared! The next carbon footprint survey will take place in early 2012 – tabulating your energy-use results from 2010. Don't forget to keep your records and to note any changes you have made to decrease your household/transportation carbon emissions. The survey guidelines are on the website for easy reference. We are making a difference!!
